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## Canadian Red Cross First Responder Course

### Course Cost:

- \$800 including taxes and course materials
- Registration is confirmed upon receipt of payment and must be completed at least 2 weeks prior to course commencement

### Course Length:

- 48 hours of class time; with an additional 8 hours of post-course EMALB Licensing Evaluations
  - Typically Monday to Saturday 08:00-18:00
  - Does not include study and preparation time

### Prerequisites:

- Current CPR level C or higher

### Post Course:

- Candidates will be required to pass the Emergency Medical Assistant's Licensing Board (EMALB) Evaluations for BC Licensure
- Candidates will be responsible for confirming local protocols if skills are applied outside of BC
