Canadian Red Cross First Aid Instructor Transfer Course

Course Cost:

- \$600 including taxes and course materials
- Registration is confirmed upon receipt of payment and must be completed at least 3 weeks prior to course commencement

Course Length:

- 20 hours including a four hour introduction and skills assessment session
 - Typically a Friday evening, 18:00-22:00 followed by a full weekend of 08:00-17:00, Saturday-Sunday
 - Does not include time to complete Pre-Course Assignments

Prerequisites: (subject to Instructor Trainer's discretion)

- Proof of current CPR-HCP certification or higher; through a regionally recognized agency
- **One** of the following:
 - First Aid or CPR Instructor with another recognized organization
 - Red Cross Water Safety Instructor plus Standard First Aid with CPR HCP or equivalent
 - Red Cross Instructor certification; expired within last 6 years
 - Teacher with Education Degree and teaching experience plus Standard First Aid with CPR HCP
- 18 years or older at time of course completion
- Strong first aid skills with the ability to perform and demonstrate skills without coaching or correction
- Suggested 2 weeks before Instructor course:
 - Observe/audit/complete a Canadian Red Cross Standard First Aid with CPR HCP course and have the instructor complete a skills checklist
 - Candidates travelling from remote areas, with limited access to Red Cross instruction, may video tape and submit their skills (accompanied by photo ID) for evaluation
 - Study/Pre-read all course materials; which will be distributed 2 weeks before start date
 - First Aid Instructor Manual
 - Instructor CD
 - Instructor DVD
 - Program Standards CD
 - First Aid & CPR student manuals

Candidates will be given pre-course assignments, 2 weeks before course commencement, by the Instructor Trainer; to be completed before the first session.

Post Course:

- Candidates will be required to "Co-Teach" alongside an existing Canadian Red Cross First Aid Instructor within 6 months of Instructor Course completion.

 - CPR levels A, B, C, and HCP
 - Emergency First Aid
 - Standard First Aid
 - Emergency Childcare First Aid
 - Standard Childcare First Aid
 - People Savers
 - Babysitting
 - Basic Marine First Aid
 - Additional courses with instructional upgrades:
 - Advanced Marine First Aid
 - Basic and Advanced Wilderness First Aid
 - First Responder
 - Emergency Medical Responder
 - Workplace Emergency First Aid (WorkSafe BC Level 1)
 - Oxygen Therapy

The course begins with a review of instructional tools; and focuses on peer presentations and experiential learning.
